

Student Instructions for Completing the Survey

Survey Purpose

The purpose of this survey is to see what you think about different aspects of your school. Schools are grateful to hear what their students think and your ideas really do make a difference.

Survey Use

Your survey is anonymous and no one will know which survey you completed. All the responses will go straight back to Avondale University who will then share the good ideas that students have suggested.

This is voluntary

This survey is voluntary and you do not have to participate. Even if you start, you are free to stop at any time. You will not be disadvantaged in any way if you choose not to participate.

Things you will notice about the survey

a) This survey was made for students who are in upper-primary through to the end of secondary school. This means you will sometimes see a question that is more suited to a younger age group, or to an older one. Simply answer these as honestly as you can.

b) Surveys have a habit of asking the same question more than once but in different ways. This is one of the ways of ensuring that the survey is valid ... so don't let it frustrate you!

How to Complete

Most of the answers are multi-choice, where you simply select how strongly you feel about something. The exact option you are looking might not be available, so just select the one that is the closest to how you feel. The following is an example of a couple of the questions:
